

## **Roberto Calabresi**

## Co-ordinator Agriculture and Forests Working Group – *Kyoto Club*

An environmental sciences graduate, with a thesis on the development of the biomass supply-chain in Italy, he has a strong agricultural-environmental background gained over the years with work experiences in Brazil, where he studied the start-up techniques to transform never-cultivated lands to extensive farming and in Malawi, where he developed tropical agriculture knowledge. In Italy he has built his expertise through participation in activities on the family farm and collaboration, which lasted eight years, with the Saplo SpA (Birra Peroni agro-industrial group), specialized in the processing of barley malt for beer production and where he developed knowledge on barleys, including their potentials for organic agriculture and for beer production. Since 2005 he works with Kyoto Club and the AzzeroCO2 ESCO – energy service company – created by Kyoto Club and Legambiente, Italy's largest environmental NGO. In addition to various publications he has contributed to, he is responsible for Kyoto Club's educational programmes, including Schools for Kyoto, aimed at spreading the culture of environmental sustainability and energy efficiency in schools, CRES, Climateresilient and Sustainability Practices, supported by the Italian Environment, Land and Sea Ministry, to raise local authorities and public servants' awareness and promote local best practices in environmental sustainability, through mitigation and adaptation to climate changes according to the principles of resilience and limitations to soil consumption in public policies.

From 2014 he is the Co-ordinator of *Kyoto Club* 's *Agriculture and Forests Working Group* and in this capacity he has been co-operating on the topics addressed by the *Organiko* project, among others, with:
