Editorial

With great pleasure we share with you the 2nd newsletter of the ORGANIKO LIFE+ project, presenting the main achievements for the period March 2016 - September 2016. The project completed one year of operations in September 2016 and the foundations for the project implementation have been established. Actions have been initiated towards the in situ measurements of greenhouse gas (CO₂ and N₂O) emissions from conventional and organic plot farms and the implementation of a children's health study in Cyprus. А series of communication activities have already taken place in both Cyprus and Italy targeting both the general population and technical stakeholders. Discussions with relevant local authorities regarding the possible provision of organic food in primary schools and universities via the application of green public procurement principles are ongoing.

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ORGANIKO LIFE+ project

ORGANIKO is a LIFE-co-funded project with duration of 4 years (2015-2019), coordinated by the Cyprus University of Technology jointly with three partners: the Agricultural Research Institute (CY), the Department of Environment (CY) and the Kyoto Club (IT). The ultimate goal of the project is to demonstrate the comparative advantages of organic versus conventional farming and products using indicators of:

- Mitigation efficiency to climate change
- Agronomic and environmental quality
- · Decreased children exposures to diet-based pesticides
 - · Healthy food promotion for better children's health


2nd Study visit in Bologna, Italy
